Resolution No. 03-2021

DECLARING CERTAIN PARCELS OF LAND OWNED BY THE ARVIN COMMUNITY SERVICE DISTRICT AS EITHER SURPLUS LAND OR EXEMPT SURPLUS LAND

WHEREAS, the California Surplus Land Act (the "Act") requires the District to take certain steps prior to disposing of surplus land that is no longer necessary for the Districts use;

WHEREAS, the District in compliance with the Act will make certain findings as to the surplus property listed in Exhibit "1" to determine if such surplus land is exempt and surplus land as defined by the Act;

Now therefore be it resolved as follows:

- 1. The District finds that the properties listed in Exhibit "1" are properties no longer necessary for the Districts use;
- 2. All other properties owned/leased by the District are not considered surplus land as they are necessary for the Districts use and/or operations;
- 3. The properties listed in Exhibit "2" attached hereto are considered surplus land that are not exempt from the Act;
- 4. The properties listed in Exhibit "3" are considered exempt surplus land under GC §54221 (0 (1) and not subject to certain provisions of the Act;
- 5. For all properties listed in Exhibit "2" the District will follow all requirements of the Act in disposing of such properties. The District authorizes District Staff to initiate the disposal / sale of all properties listed in Exhibits "2" and "3".



INTRODUCTION

The Arvin Community Services District (ACSD or District) has addressed the arsenic problem in the community and has taken the following steps as set forth in the consent order:

- 1. Compliance with the Arsenic MCL Arsenic Mitigation Project for the Source Wells (Proposition 84 Project Phase I and Phase II by the District)
- 2. Install Blue Bottle Vending Machines at the District Office (Cleanup & Abatement Project by the District)
- 3. Furnish testing for Point of Use Treatment Systems at Schools, Parks, etc. (RCAC Project)

PROJECT UPDATES

1. Compliance with the Arsenic MCL - Arsenic Mitigation Project for the Source Wells

The District completed construction on Phase 1 of the Arsenic Mitigation Project to address the arsenic in the existing system water wells in September 2016. Phase 1 involved drilling and equipping two new municipal water well facilities, Well #13 and Well #14, and connecting them to the existing ACSD distribution system. Phase 2 of the project involves drilling and equipping three additional municipal water well facilities and constructing a 1.0 MG welded steel storage tank and booster pump station.

Current Progress Summary

The Phase II portion of the project for Well No. 16, Well No. 17, and the 1.0MG Storage Tank and Booster Pump Station facilities were completed on November 30, 2020. In addition, a third well, Well No. 12, that was constructed under the EPA Grant No. 99T44701, was completed on May 31, 2021.

1. Phase IIB Milestones:

- A. Milestones i and ii have been met.
- B. Milestones iii, iv, v, and vi, for Phase IIB of the District's Arsenic Mitigation Project have been completed.

The project was awarded by the Arvin Community Services District to the low bidder, W.M. Lyles Company, on April 19th, 2019 in the amount of \$11,210,288.00. The contract agreements were executed on May 8th, 2019 and all bonds and insurance submitted in accordance with the contract documents. The Notice to Proceed was issued to W.M. Lyles Company on May 20th, 2019 and in turn, the project completion date was established as May 20th, 2020. The project completion date was extended due to COVID-19 impacts and corresponding equipment delays. The project substantial completion date is November 30, 2020, however this does not account for the inclusion of the Well No. 18 site in the scope of work.

W.M. Lyles began mobilizing the project site the week of June 24th, 2019 and began potholing and locating underground utilities. The well drilling subcontractor, Bakersfield Well & Pump Company, then completed the drilling, construction, and development of Well No. 16 and Well No. 17.



As discussed in previous quarterly reports, the Well No. 15 water quality depth sampling did not result in favorable water quality results and therefore the well site was abandoned.

The District Board voted to abandon this well on Monday, September 30th, 2019. The District has acquired a new well site property in Section 3, T32S, R29E south of Well No. 12 and Well No. 17. The well site property is a 1-acre site on APN 446-010-10 which was previously owned by Crystal Organic Farms, LLC. This

well site is referred to as Well No. 18. The District has executed a Surface Use and Test Well Agreement and a Purchase and Sale Agreement with the property owner. The Phase 1 Assessment was completed for the property and the test well bid process administered. Johnson Well Drilling completed the test well and the water quality data is shown below in Table 2.

In regards to Well No. 18, the District also adopted Addendum No. 2 to the Mitigated Negative Declaration prepared for the Arsenic Mitigation Project at the

January 25th, 2021 board meeting and filed the Notice of Determination with the County of Kern and State Clearinghouse.

In addition, the District has completed the Well 12 Improvement Project under a separate contract. This well is associated with the CW-1 Well Replacement Project under U.S. EPA Grant No. 99T44701. The Contractor has completed the well site development project. The water quality test results for Well No. 12, sampled on March 26, 2021 demonstrated that the well is in compliance with all Title 22 Drinking Water Standards and has an Arsenic concentration of 3 to 5 ppb, see attached results in Appendix D.

C. A summary of the Arsenic quarterly testing results for the District wells is shown below in Table 3 and also attached in Appendix A.

Well No. 14 has had a few recent test results above the MCL of 10 ppb and this is thought to be a result of plugging in some of the well. The District has performed a chemical and mechanical cleaning of the well to remove the plugging and reduce the Arsenic concentration back to original levels. They are currently flushing and testing the well.

D. The project has resulted in the District having five new water supply wells with a sixth well, Well No. 18, still in process. Well No. 12, Well No. 13, Well No. 14, Well No. 16, and Well No. 17 are all providing water to the system with an Arsenic concentration less than the MCL of 10 ppb (with the recent exception of Well No. 14).




Figure 1: POU Arsenic Results

This is illustrated by the results of the Arsenic testing at the POU devices throughout the District system. The wells 16 & 17 were in full-time operation in mid-August. Therefore, the September 22, 2020 test results shown in Figure 1 below illustrates the reduction in Arsenic concentrations and compliance with the MCL of 10 ppb.

In addition, the SWB has permitted the District to blend the existing Well No. 10 and Well No. 11 at the new storage tank site with water from Wells 16 & 17 such that the tank effluent water has an Arsenic concentration less than or equal to 8 ppb. The blending sample point is on the outlet of the storage tank or suction manifold and is to be sampled bi-weekly for Arsenic and monthly for Total Coliform.

2. Install Blue Bottle Vending Machines at the District Office (Cleanup & Abatement Project by the District)

The District has installed three Blue Bottle Vending Machines at the District Office. The vending machines treat the water using reverse osmosis and then also polish the water with a carbon adsorption media. It is estimated that eighty-percent (80%) of the District customers come into the office on a monthly basis to pay their bills. This has aided in making the machines visible and accessible to the community. Signage has also been installed at the vending machines in English and Spanish to notify customers that treated water is available there. The District provides each customer with free water from the vending machines and the customers utilize their own bottles to obtain the treated water in 1 gallon, 3 gallon, or 5 gallon increments.

Water Quality Testing

Water quality testing has been performed on the vending machines between January 2021 and July 2021. The State established the following source codes for the vending machines:

Current Progress Summary

The vending machines are all operational. Certified District Staff inspect the vending machines every week to ensure they are clean and in working order. Water samples are being collected by District Staff on a biweekly basis and the results submitted to the State Water Board on a monthly basis.

The District will continue operating and maintaining the vending machines in accordance with the product manufacturers recommendations and the sampling requirements of the State Water Board.

3. Point of Use Treatment Systems at Schools, Parks, etc. (RCAC Project)

The Point of Use (POU) Treatment Systems are being installed by the Rural Community Assistance Corporation (RCAC) and are being tested by the District as directed by RCAC. These units have been installed throughout schools and public locations within the City of Arvin including Bear Mountain Elementary School and Pre-School, El Camino Real Elementary School, Haven Drive Middle School, Sierra Vista Elementary School, Arvin High School, the Library, the Veterans Hall, and the Community Center. The RCAC and State Water Board (SWB) are making every effort to get the word out to the community and have installed signage at each device noting that it is a location of treated water for drinking purposes.

Water Quality Testing


Water quality testing by the District is being performed on a rotating schedule with samples being collected every month. There are 13 units installed at the Bear Mountain Elementary School, 9 units installed at El Camino Real Elementary School, 13 units at Haven Drive Middle School, 9 units at the Sierra Vista Elementary School, and approximately 30 units at the Arvin High School. The results are attached in Appendix C.



ECR-1 thru 5 have prefilter sample ports.


